NIGERIA | Pastor Asks For Prayer

Nigeria is in the middle of the worst humanitarian crisis since World War II. If they want access to any of these things in the camps, they must convert to Islam.

But despite the persecution, the church is full of faith. A Pastor in Gwoza, Nigeria has asked us to partner with his church in prayer.

"And thirdly that we will not give up, nor will we give up our faith. That we will continue in the faith dynamically, strongly, vibrant and bold!" - Nigerian pastor
