YAWO

Sally, Cam, Kath and their children received their visa in South Africa without any difficulties and they are now all in Mozambique. Their smooth entry is wonderful considering the many years of challenges the team has faced in receiving visas, and the trouble Tobias and Heather recently experienced in entering the country. In arriving in Mozambique to begin her first term as a long-term cross-cultural worker, Sally felt a reassuring sense of being 'home'. She will shortly begin her culture and language lessons with a Yawo friend.

YAWO

ETHNIC THAI

Paul and Cathy have returned to Australia following service in Thailand. Over their years in Thailand, Paul developed deep friendships with some current and former monks in the city. Many of them have now returned to their homes across Thailand and other areas. They are still hungry to learn more about Jesus but this difficult due to their geographical isolation. Paul is working on connecting with them through an online forum where they will be able to continue their spiritual conversations.

For Prayer:

- The family as they transition back into life, work and study in Australia
- The online forum will become a supportive community where spiritual conversations can occur and faith can grow
- Believers and seekers who are isolated from other followers of Jesus would know God's presence

KHMER

Rob and Deb continue to develop their language skills and cultural understanding through daily sessions and connecting with local Khmer in the community. They have begun using wordless books to tell simple stories in Khmer and then hearing their local language nurturer retell the story. Though they are still at a very basic level of Khmer, these story telling skills are beginning to form foundations for culturally relevant story telling which they will use when they share from the Bible. Rob and Deb continue to regularly connect with their friends at the coffee cart, who have welcomed a baby girl into their family.

For Prayer:

- Patience and passion for culture and language learning as they keep in mind why they are learning
- Training of new language nurturers for the many candidates who plan to join the team this year
- Growing partnership teams for the candidates preparing to serve in Cambodia
