

KENYA | Garrissa University one year on

A young lady, Purity, asked an Open Doors worker, "What time is it now?" Upon informing her it was around noon, she said, "This time last year I was eight month[s] pregnant and lying under a bed, not daring to move and begging God to save my baby. He did! Though I lay on my belly under the bed for 12 hours, my son survived. I named him Kiama, - [meaning] Miracle."

Purity was one of the survivors of an attack by al-Shabaab militants on a university in Garissa, Kenya. 147 students were killed in the attack, when extremists went through the dorms killing Christians and telling Muslims they could leave.

The refresher workshop is intended to provide you an update on Safe Church policies and procedures.

If you are a pastor, elder, deacon (policy decision maker), a ministry leader, a childrens/youth team member or leader, SRE teacher or minister to any vulnerable people, and have already completed the full awareness workshop, you are required to attend regular Safe Church refresher courses such as this.

This course will cover:

- duty of care, codes of conduct, positional power, transparency and accountability
- protecting vulnerable people including children at risk of harm – definitions, indicators and response procedures
- information about training, recruiting and supervising leaders
- how to establish and run safe church ministry programs including risk management
