

Palestinian Territories

At the end of June, as Ramadan commenced, threatening leaflets were distributed to Christians by those claiming to be from the self-proclaimed Islamic State. On the leaflet is written, "We tell the heretic Christians, you must clear out immediately or we'll massacre you on Eid al-Fitr, marking the end of Ramadan." Another section of the leaflet encourages Muslims to pass on the details of any Christians they know.

These leaflets come at a time of increased violence toward Christians living in the Palestinian Territories, but this is the first threat potentially made by the Islamic State itself. The leaflets have been accompanied by similar threats on social media but some Christians did not receive a leaflet, and some areas have been targeted more with the material.

Questions are now being asked if the leaflets are in fact from the Islamic State. One person has pointed out that some of the rhetoric used is out of date and no longer matches other Islamic State publications. Others have suggested that this might be a scare campaign orchestrated by another group to create fear and achieve other political outcomes.

Regardless of who is behind these leaflets, it has certainly caused fear and anxiety in the community of believers. While many have showed defiance in the face of this and refused to stop meeting together, it has generated valid concern for the safety of Christians living in the Palestinian Territories.

Pray with us:

- Pray that these leaflets, no matter how frightening, would simply be empty threats and this would not become a reality in Jerusalem.
- Pray for wisdom for the body of believers who are currently feeling pressed on all sides in the Middle East.
- Pray for the people who handed out these materials, whether or not they are from the Islamic State, that they would see the pain and uncertainty this has caused and repent.
